RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, a decision was made by the Tribal Council to discontinue Indian Development District of Arizona which has provided Economic Development Administration planning services to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Economic Development Administration has indicated that it will give consideration to the continuance of planning services to the White Mountain Apache Tribe through a direct grant, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has in the past received in excess of two million dollars in grants from the Economic Development Administration, and
- WHEREAS, it is vital that every effort be made to continue the planning services previously provided through Indian Development District of Arizona to assure that continued economic development on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation be made for the benefit of the tribal members.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires that application be made to the Economic Development Administration for a direct grant to the White Mountain Apache Tribe for the continuance of the planning services previously provided through Indian Development District of Arizona.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is directed and authorized to submit such an application and to sign any and all documents necessary to effectuate such a program.

The foregoing resolution was on June 3, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approvedby the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
