## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Ivan Kitcheyan, Chairman of the Housing Authority reported to the Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Housing Authority is having difficulty collecting from some of the participants, and
- WHEREAS, the project containing 45 houses and a future project containing 150 houses are being held up pending the success of the Housing Authority in collecting bad or back bills, and
- WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development has required the Housing Authority to reduce the amount of indebtedness for back rent.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in the interest of maintaining present housing and procurement of future housing, that the tribal council supports every effort of the Housing Authority in collecting the past due rents.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the feeling of the Tribal Council that those people delinquent in rent payment are working a hardship on the Housing Authority and the White Mountain Apache Tribe by making it more difficult to maintain the present houses and get programs for additional new houses.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
