## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Ivan Kitcheyan, Chairman of the Housing Authority, reported to the Council, and
- WHEREAS, one of the conditions for additional housing projects outlined by Housing and Urban Development, it was mandatory for the tribe to establish access roads as No. 1 Priority, and
- WHEREAS, in the interest of being granted additional housing projects, the Tribal Council accepts this commitment as one of the many conditions for additional houses, and
- WHEREAS, the commitment made by the Superintendent on March 22, 1976 was not accepted by the Housing and Urban Development and the reason is unknown.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the grant program year, Roads Construction Program be modified to list the needed access roads for the two pending projects from Housing and Urban Development as being No. 1 Priority.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman notify the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency and the Chairman of the Roads Committee that this new priority has been established and that every effort should be made to satisfy the Housing and Urban Development without further jeopardizing the tribal housing program.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
