RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 100 of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, Game and Fish Code was accepted by the Tribal Council in the meeting of June, 1976, and
- WHEREAS, upon accepting the ordinance, the council had agreed to further discuss the privilege by marriage, and
- WHEREAS, the council specified that the privilege by marriage would be controlled annually by resolution, and
- WHEREAS, after much deliberation the council determined that the privilege by marriage would be granted from July 8, 1976 to July, 1977.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that annually the council will review the privilege by marriage and that if and when granted, may be used only by American Indians having proof of an affiliation and being a member of a recognized tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this privilege being granted as a courtesy of the White Mountain Apache Tribal members must not be abused and that all Tribal laws and ordinances are to be followed and respected, including Tribal legally recognized marriages recorded and on file with the Tribal Statistician.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f & i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
