RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, in 1971, Michael and Pat Cooley were granted a Twenty-five (25) year business lease on the Cibecue Trading Post, and
- WHEREAS, it was the determination of the tribe that tribal fees be waived for a five-year period as an incentive to the White Mountain Apache people to enter into business leases, and
- WHEREAS, the five-year period has passed and the council has re-evaluated the business incentive to be used on all tribal member business leases, and
- WHEREAS, it was determined that the lessee would procure a trader's license and would pay one cent (1¢) per gallon on gasoline sold and pay one-half of one percent (1%) of the gross receipts from the business, and
- WHEREAS, it was determined that the basic lease fee would remain the same.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Cibecue lease to Michael and Pat Cooley will be subject to the following fees:

Traders license 1¢ for each gallon of gas sold 1/2 of 1% of the gross receipts

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a new evaluation will be made again in 1981.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these stipulations and percentages will apply under all tribal member leases now in effect with the five year deferment of fees.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
