RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has discussed the Vernon Road from McNary to the Reservation Boundary, and
- WHEREAS, the road needs to be improved to assist Fort Apache Timber Company in the logging operation, and
- WHEREAS, the National Forest Service is willing to commit funds to realign and reconstruct the Vernon Road, and
- WHEREAS, the county of Apache County has agreed to maintain the road after completion.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman and Superintendent be authorized and directed to grant a right-of-way to the county of Apache County, Arizona, from McNary to the Reservation Boundary.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the understanding of the Tribal Council that the National Forest, Department of Agriculture will rebuild the road and in return for the right-of-way, Apache County Roads Maintenance will maintain the road.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the width of the right-of-way granted to Apache County will not exceed 66 feet.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
