RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concerned over the Civil Rights of its members, and

WHEREAS, there is a need for legal services, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to have established on the reservation, an office of Legal Aid.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman, Tribal Attorney and the Law and Order Committee are authorized and directed to pursue any form of legal aid that might be made available to assist members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (d & i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
