

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Claims Committee reported to the council on progress for Claim 22-D, and

WHEREAS, there is a strong need to establish a position for a Recreational Director, an Assistant and a clerk to the Recreational Director, reservation wide to project and plan and initiate under the settlement of Docket 22-D.

BE IT RESOLVED by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Recreational Director and Assistant be established as tribal jobs serving the entire reservation to develop details required under publication of January 13, 1976 in the Federal Register required by Claims Commission for the Western Apache Indians.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the operating funds be expended from the \$10,000.00 line item currently in the approved tribal budget and when this account is exhausted, the Chairman is authorized and directed to increase this account by modifying the tribal budget for the required needs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the money expended initiating this program is to be reimbursed to the White Mountain Apache Tribe from the funds of the settlement of Docket 22-D.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the establishment of job descriptions and selection of these two employees is the responsibility of the Land Claims Committee.

The foregoing resolution was on July 7, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
