## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHERFAS, in the budget hearings for the Tribal Fiscal Year of 1976-77, members of the Police Department were denied the 5.5 salary increase, and
- WHEREAS, the Police Department was denied this annual raise because of the misunderstanding of the mixing of Law Enforcement Association Administration funds, and
- WHEREAS, the tribe has reconsidered the proposal from the Police Department for the 5.5 annual increase.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Police Department be granted the 5.5 annual increase effective May 1, 1976.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorized and directed to amend the tribal budget to reflect an increase of \$13,000.00 for this salary increase.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Budget be amended by \$13,000.00 and that these funds be appropriated from funds on deposit with the United States Treasury.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorized and directed to sign any and all documents to consumate these budget increases.

The foregoing resolution was on August 11, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
