RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, on August 4, 1967, the White Mountain Apache Tribe entered into an "Agreement For the Designation of a Certain Road on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation as a State Highway"; namely, the Hawley Lake Road Route No. 54, and
- WHEREAS, said Agreement provided that the Tribe will enact and enforce appropriate rules or regulations prohibiting any logging truck or other vehicle of comparable size and weight to travel or otherwise move upon Hawley Lake Road for the purpose of hauling or conveying logs, and
- WHEREAS, the tribe presently needs to utilize said road for the purposes of one salvage log truck in the operations of the tribally-owned Fort Apache Timber Company; and other possible routes would not expeditiously serve the necessary purpose and are extremely unsafe, and
- WHEREAS, said use of the Hawley Lake Road by one logging vehicle would not be detrimental to the State right-of-way.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby requests that the State Highway Commission, Arizona Highway Department, agree to allow the White Mountain Apache Tribe to authorize the use of Hawley Lake Road by one salvage log truck necessary to Fort Apache Timber Company operations without expense to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on August 12, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
