RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has become concerned over the numerous complaints concerning horses running loose in populated area at the Hawley Lake Homesite area, and
- WHEREAS, this situation creates potential danger to persons and property in said area, and
- WHEREAS, the Governing Body is charged with the duty and responsibility of protecting the health, safety and welfare of persons within its jurisdiction, and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Glen W. Stover operates a riding stable in the Hawley Lake area and is responsible for the control of his horses in said operation, as the Stable's Manager.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council directs that Mr. Glen W. Stover maintain his horses within pens and prohibit them from roaming loose in the Hawley Lake area.

The foregoing resolution was on August 12, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Anended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
