RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is now a distributor for liquefied petroleum, and
- WHEREAS, this distributorship is creating employment to local tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the price on the reservation is going to be competitive with prices off of the reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, that they request the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the U. S. Public Health Service to purchase all liquefied petroleum products from the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Buy-Indian Authority be used by the Government Agencies to purchase the product.

The foregoing resolution was on August 12, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
