## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is attentive to the fact that law enforcement personnel of the Arizona Department of Public Safety, County Sheriff Departments, local police departments, and Federal Agencies are present and operating within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation from time to time; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes that such Federal, State, and Local Law Enforcement Agencies lend law enforcement assistance and expertise to the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department, and that law and order on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation may thereby be benefitted; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires that continued cooperation and mutual respect be maintained between the Tribal Police Department and such federal, state and local law enforcement agencies in the interest of bettered law enforcement and the protection of persons and property within the Reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby authorizes the Chief of Police of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department to accept and utilize the assistance and expertise of law enforcement personnel of the Department of Public Safety, County Sheriff Departments, Local Police Departments, and Federal Agencies in the interests of securing law enforcement responsibilities and the protection of persons and property within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and to issue tribal law enforcement commissions to such federal, state or local agency personnel as he deems necessary to carry out the provisions of this Resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council specifically provides that such authorizations are herein given for the purpose of continued cooperation and mutual respect between such law enforcement agencies designated in providing law and order on the Reservation, and that same strictly requires all law enforcement personnel present and operating within the Reservation to adhere to the confines of the tribal laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on October 15, 1976, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (8) and (u) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
