

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the funds have been appropriated for a new hospital in Whiteriver,
and

WHEREAS, there is a great need to replace the old hospital that is outdated
and very small, and


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is very concerned about the
construction delay in relation to the health of its members.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that
the U. S. Public Health Service immediately start construction of
the proposed hospital for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the contract be published immediately and
stipulations be placed in the contract protecting the local
Apaches in the labor market and that construction start as soon as
possible to relieve the Tribe of poor health care conditions and
the high unemployment rate.

The foregoing resolution was on November 3, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of
10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the
Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27,
1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant
to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
