WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Health Authority has submitted ten (10) separate project proposals to the Phoenix Area Indian Health Service for funding under P. L. 93-638, the Indian Self-Determination Act, and

WHEREAS, the following list of project proposals has been prioritized in order of importance and need:

Health Sciences Library	33,841.00

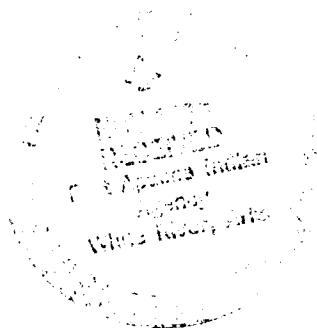


WHEREAS, the remaining three (3) project proposals will be acted upon by the Indian Health Service at a later date by mutual agreement with the White Mountain Apache Health Authority.


BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council endorses and supports these proposed projects toward the goal of improving the health care of the White Mountain Apache people.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council designates the Tribal Chairman, or his authorized representative, to act in the capacity of grant and contract negotiate for the seven (7) proposed projects named above with the Phoenix Area Indian Health Service on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on November 3, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
