

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has become aware of a serious problem concerning the availability of qualified and adequately trained escorts for medical emergency flights from Whiteriver to Phoenix, and

WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service Hospital does not have sufficient staff to deliver quality health care at an optimum level to the White Mountain Apache people, and

WHEREAS, budgetary constraints imposed by higher levels of authority prevent the service unit from employing qualified escorts for medical emergency flights.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Phoenix Indian Health area make every effort to obtain additional funding to alleviate this very serious problem immediately.

The foregoing resolution was on December 1, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
