RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is increasingly aware of its need for community health care and is dedicated to providing the most effective health care services for its people, and
- WHEREAS, the Community Health Representative Program, in cooperation with the United States Indian Health Service, has provided the only community health care available to White Mountain Apache people, and
- WHEREAS, the Community Health Representative Program now employs twenty one (21) White Mountain Apaches who are crowded into two small offices (about 300 sq. ft.) which is inadequate for meeting the objectives of the program, and
- WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year, 1977 budget for the Community Health Representative Program has been increased by Indian Health Service from \$191,000.00 to \$257,000.00 to include the lease of a double-wide office trailer.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe shall purchase a double-wide office trailer to be leased to the Community Health Representative Program at a rate not to exceed \$528.00 per month for a total of thirty-six (36) months.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that funds be appropriated from the United States Treasury in the amount of \$20,000.00 for said trailer purchase and that the Fiscal Year, 1977 Budget for the Community Health Representative Program be amended accordingly.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Chairman is hereby directed and authorized to take such action and execute such documents as are necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on December 1, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
