RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe duly enacted Ordinance 101, on November 2, 1976, for the enforcement of Arizona Traffic laws, as tribal law, on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, subsequently, some dispute has arisen as to the effectuation of said Ordinance under the provisions of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to clarify and re-certify its intent to make Ordinance 101 effective.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, that it hereby reaffirms the enactment of Ordinance 101 on November 2, 1976 for the enforcement of Arizona Traffic laws, as tribal law, on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on January 6, 1977, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (q) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
