

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, an incident occurred recently wherein a Tribal members was overcome by what was apparently carbon monoxide resulting from a faulty heating furnace, and

WHEREAS, the majority of heating units on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are operated from gas, and

WHEREAS, there has been no effective means for the Tribal members to obtain service for the gas units in their homes thereby creating potentially dangerous situations which could cause the loss of a life, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council that a program be instituted with properly trained personnel to check all gas lines and units operating from gas on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation belonging to Tribal members at no cost to them for the safety and welfare of the Tribal members.


BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be authorized and directed to institute such a program.


The foregoing resolution was on February 2, 1977 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
