RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Grasshopper site is of great historical significance to the Apache people, the State of Arizona and the United States, and;
- WHEREAS, in the interest of history and preserving the historical significance of the Apache Reservation, and;
- WHEREAS, in the future the commercial potential could be of benefit to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Grasshopper historic area be nominated to the National Historic Register as soon as possible.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the area designated not to exceed eighty (80) acres and remain available for use for grazing.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council be authorized and directed to sign any and all documents required for the submission of the historical site nomination.

The foregoing resolution was on August 3, 1977, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
