RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs rebuild Route 60; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way beginning at the end of the second project (Resolution No. 77-51) another 5.680 miles, 100 feet in width; Total 16.42 miles. From Rock Creek Ranger Station to Beaver Dam Junction.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that it grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a
 gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on a map on file in
 the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian
 Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, to which reference is hereby
 made.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no fencing of the Right-of-Way take place on this section of Route 60.

The foregoing resolution was on August 16, 1977, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
