RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the tribe has available from EDA/LPW funds approximately \$625,000.00 for construction of a gymnasium at Cibecue, and
- WHEREAS, the project was placed for bid and only one bidder bid on the project with a bid of \$821,115.00 after deducting alternates, and
- WHEREAS, the construction funds available are insufficient to construct the project unless the dressing rooms and public areas are deleted, and
- WHEREAS, deleting all of these areas will render the facility inadequate for the needs of the Cibecue residents, and
- WHEREAS, there is available on hand funds in Revenue Sharing in the amount of \$150,000.00 which are not committed which can be utilized to supplement the EDA/LPW funds and thereby allow construction of the project deleting only that section which contained area for concession stand and game room but retaining the dressing rooms and public areas in the front of the facility.
- BE IT RESOLVED that funds in the amount of \$150,000.00 in Revenue Sharing be allocated to supplement EDA/LPW funds for the Cibecue Gymnasium.

The foregoing resolution was on December 13, 1977 duly adopted by a vote of 2 abst.
