

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a new graveled road along the present alignment of Route 48, from Highway 73 near Lester Oliver's residence toward Big Springs, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way from the beginning of the project at Highway 73, 100 feet in width and 7.496 miles in length.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on a map on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.


The foregoing resolution was on January 10, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
