

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council discussed the need for bridges to be constructed at or around Hazel Tortice's house at Seven Mile and across the Carrizo Creek in the community of Carrizo, and

WHEREAS, it was felt that both bridges would not only affect the community, but also the school bus route, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires that the Roads Committee evaluate these bridge sites.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that they request a construction of the bridge across East Fork of Whiteriver near the home of Hazel Tortice and a bridge across Carrizo Creek in the community of Carrizo.

BE IT RESOLVED that these two bridges be included in the Agency Road Program at the earliest opportunity.

The foregoing resolution was on February 2, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
