WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, in keeping with the request of the Arizona State Justice Planning Agency for selection of a task force member and a Tribal Criminal Justice Planner, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has considered Councilman, Adam Lupe, Sr. to fill this position, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council designates that this individual have the authority to represent the tribe in matters relating to the LEAA/ASJPA Program, and
- WHEREAS, it is understood that the mileage and per diem expenses will be paid by Arizona State Justice Planning Agency.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Mr. Adam Lupe, Sr. is hereby designated as the White Mountain Apache representative to the Justice Planning Task Force and is further designated as a Tribal Criminal Justice Planner.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that with this position goes the authority for Councilman Adam Lupe, Sr. to represent the tribe in all matters relating to the LEAA/ASJPA Programs.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Adam Lupe, Sr. shall report of the Justice Planning Programs at 90-day intervals to the Tribal Council.


The foregoing resolution was on May 11, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
