## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). as amended, to exercise certain rights of home rule and be responsible for the general welfare of its membership, and
- WHEREAS, the Constitution and By-Laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe designates the Tribal Council as the sole governing body of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, Public Law 93-638, the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act and Public Law 94-437, the Indian Health Care Improvement Act, provide the means by which recognized Indian Tribes can plan and implement programs in health and health-related areas by grants and contracts from or with the Indian Health Service, and
- WHEREAS, there exists a dearth of trained professionals, belonging to our tribe, in the field of medicine and the health-related fields.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to exercise its right of self-determination by applying for a grant titled "Health Careers Development Program" and that the Tribal Chairman be authorized to sign the application.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that administrative responsibility for the Health Careers Development Program shall be assigned in accordance with Tribal Resolution No. 78-22.

The foregoing resolution was on May 11, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (s) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
