

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council discussed the need for Special Deputy Commission, and

WHEREAS, it was indicated that the Superintendent is hesitant to issue Special Deputy Cards, and

WHEREAS, it was discussed that the liability assumed by the Federal Government and the need is well-trained, well-qualified individuals to be available for issue.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Superintendent be requested to review qualifications of the White Mountain Apache Police Force and the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise to see about the possibility of identifying qualified individuals.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council and the Superintendent support a training program so that more people will meet the qualification of the requirement for Deputy Special Officers of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.


