## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Ms. Marie-Louise Liebe-Harkort discussed with the council an interest to work with the Education Department and the people involved in developing bi-lingual bi-cultural program, and
- WHEREAS, the project would include creating new materials for teaching the reading and writing of Apache; developing and teaching aids for the use of the materials and developing techniques to assist the older Apaches in reading the Apache language, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurred with the philosophy of the project, and
- WHEREAS, it was the understanding of the Tribal Council that no cost would be incurred by the Triba and that the work would be done in conjunction with the Tribal Education Office.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Marie-Louise Liebe-Harkort, who is under a study grant from the German Research Society, be permitted to carry on the project.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the understanding of the Tribal Council that any materials or research papers produced will be given to the Tribe prior to any publication or other use for review.

The foregoing resolution was on May 31, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29,1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
