RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Council discussed Ordinance No. 31 and Ordinance No. 99, and

WHEREAS, the horses are creating a road hazard and damaging the Rangeland, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is in strong support to control the horses on the highways and rangeland.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Ordinance No. 31 and Ordinance No. 99 be enforced as required by the Tribal Law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each Live Stock Association enforce on their grazing unit these ordinances and that the General Livestock Coordinator is directed to carry out the Law and assist each association.

The foregoing resolution was on September 13, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
