

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Continental Telephone Company of the West has requested a right-of-way to bury cables along existing road rights-of-way on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the construction of this telephone line will improve the services in the Whiteriver, East Fork, Seven Mile and Fort Apache areas, and
- WHEREAS, said telephone company has deposited in a special deposit account at the Fort Apache Agency the sum of \$2,486.20 to cover the estimated right-of-way cost and damages.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Superintendent is hereby authorized to grant a right-of-way, 12.431 miles in length and 10 feet wide to the Continental Telephone Company of the West, pursuant to the official plat of said area on file in the office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, for a period of not to exceed fifty years.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right-of-way agreement shall provide that Continental Telephone Company of the West shall repair and maintain all fences which might be damaged by construction or maintenance of said right-of-way.


The foregoing resolution was on November 08, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
