

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has surveyed Route 12 from Cibecue to Grasshopper, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous right-of-way from the Cibecue school 100 feet in width a distance of 6.016 miles, 125 feet in width, a distance of 0.553 miles and 150 feet in width a distance of 0.492 miles for a total distance of 7.061 miles.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous right-of-way as recorded on a map on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no construction is scheduled at this time. The wide areas in the right-of-way requests are for wide cuts or wide fills.

The foregoing resolution was on November 09, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 3 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
