


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is entitled to participate in the Federal Excess Property Program under 41 CFR, Part. 101.43 and pursuant to an agreement between the Tribe and the Economic Development Administration, dated April 12, 1978, and
- WHEREAS, The Tribe's participation in said Program, as well as the Federal Surplus Property Donation Program, under Public Law 94-519, is significantly beneficial to the economic development of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, such programs assist in serving the purposes of the Federal Government in developing tribes and encouraging tribal self-determination, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised that the Economic Development Administration intends to terminate tribal participation in the Federal Excess Property Program for the sole reason that Economic Development Administration is understaffed to administer such program, and
- WHEREAS, termination of tribal participation will effectively cut-off any source of supply to the Tribe of quality and usable excess federal property needed by the Tribe and will defeat the contribution of such program to tribal development.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby urgently requests the Economic Development Administration continue tribal participation in the Federal Excess Property Program under 41 CFR. Part. 101-43 dated April 12, 1978 and pursuant to its Agreement with the Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby seeks the assistance of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Arizona Congressional Delegation in carrying out the purposes of this Resolution and securing the Tribe's participation in this program in the interests of the tribal development.

The foregoing resolution was on November 17, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
