

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to delivery of quality mental health services for its tribal members, and


WHEREAS, the Tribe is in need of additional properly trained and qualified personnel to deliver these mental health services, and

WHEREAS, the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (PI 93-638) provides for the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, through the U. S. Indian Health Service, to enter into contract with tribes to provide these services.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it request from the Phoenix Area Indian Health Services office, a contract beginning June 1, 1979 through October 1, 1979 (to be renewed for three additional years), providing for the full mental health service functions of the Whiteriver Public Health Service Unit. Specific staff requested are one psychologist position, one clerk-typist position, and one mental health technician position.
TOTAL BUDGET AMOUNT: \$63,036.00.

The foregoing resolution was on December 13, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
