RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is committed to quality health care for the White Mountain Apache people, and
- WHEREAS, the community of Cibecue, second largest on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, continues to experience health care problems at a level significantly higher than the rest of the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service is presently involved in the construction of a new clinic facility in the community of Cibecue, and
- WHEREAS, the people of Cibecue, at a community meeting over a year ago, voted unanimously to request that Indian Health Service station at least one qualified medical doctor at the new clinic facility.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe supports the request of the people of Cibecue, and hereby demands, that Indian Health Service recruit two qualified physicians to be stationed at the new Cibecue clinic upon the opening of that facility in 1979 in order to properly provide for the health care needs of tribal members in Cibecue.
- The foregoing resolution was on December 13, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
