RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a new graveled road along the present alignment of Route 48, from Highway 73 near Lester Oliver's Residence toward Big Springs, and
- WHEREAS, a cinder pit is needed for the removal of approximately 25,000 yards, and
- WHEREAS, the use of cinders from the Cooley Truck Trail Pit is recommended, and
- WHEREAS, the cinder pit will be cleaned and sloped after use.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is hereby granted permission to remove cinders by contract and that the royalty is hereby waived in lieu of benefits received.

The foregoing resolution was on March 14, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
