RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe continues to assert its immemorial, prior and superior rights to the water on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised and aware that utilization of the Tribe's water is important and necessary to the development, present and future of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to seek all funding available for the development and full utilization of tribal water.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that it hereby directs that all sources of funding
 be sought through the Apache Planning Office for the
 purpose of fully developing and utilizing water by the
 Tribe on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Apache Planning Office is hereby directed to report its progress periodically to the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on March 15, 1979, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
