

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is continuously interested in the development and advancement of the human resources of the tribe, and

WHEREAS, such development demands all critical and adequate governmental services of the tribe, including the protection of life and property, the provision for proper counselling, rehabilitation and probation services, and the operation of professional law enforcement and judicial services, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised and aware that the needs and problems of its governmental services increase with the growth and expansion of the tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Law and Order Committee of the Tribal Council has investigated currently available governmental services facilities and recommends to the Council the establishment of an updated and expanded facilities for judicial, rehabilitation, and police governmental services.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby finds that the development and advancement of the human resources of the tribe requires the establishment of an updated and expanded governmental services facility to provide for current and increasing judicial rehabilitation and police governmental services needs of the White Mountain Apache people.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council designates such governmental services project a priority in human resource development projects on the reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby requests the full assistance of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Department of the Interior, in obtaining federal funding of said project for and on behalf of the tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized to undertake all such contacts or correspondence as are necessary to expedite the fulfillment of the purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on April 04, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
