

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the North Fork Livestock Association has requested that the Tribal Council assign to it, the land contained in the old Pettis Ranch, approximately sixty (60) acres, for the purpose of cultivating alfalfa for livestock feed, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has fully considered this request and finds that it is in the best interest of the livestock industry on the reservation that this project be undertaken, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that this project is in the best interest of the entire tribe as a proper use of the water and land.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the assignment of the old Pettis Ranch, as more fully described in a map on file with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, to the North Fork Livestock Association for the purpose of cultivating alfalfa for livestock feed.

The foregoing resolution was on June 07, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


