## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is aware that the current practices for tribal members to obtain approval of homesite assignments in unsurveyed range areas includes the approval of the District Livestock Board, and
- WHEREAS, the North Fork Livestock Board requests the Tribal Council relieve it of such responsibility and that designation of homesite land assignment be done by a complete survey within the unassigned areas south of Mrs. Delta Brewer's residence along Highway 73, and
- WHEREAS, the North Fork Livestock Board further requests that the Tribal Council required a continuous easement, wide enough between the Highway Right-of-Way fence and private homesite fences, for the purpose of allowing livestock to be driven through such area, as needed, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has considered these requests and finds them to be reasonable and in the best interest of the residents and livestock association so affected.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that the proposed housing development on land assignments in the North Fork District, south of Delta Brewer's residence, and along the Highway 73, be undertaken by a survey of reangelands within such area and upon authorization of the Tribal Council, without the prior determination of the North Fork Livestock Board.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council directs that an easement is hereby give to the North Fork Livestock Association between the Highway Right-of-Way fences and individual homesite fences, for the purpose of a livestock driveway, as needed.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that individual homeowners affected by this decision shall be notified in advance that fencing up to the Highway Right-of-Way fence across this easement is hereby prohibited.

The foregoing resolution was on June 12, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
