

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Emergency Medical Services has submitted an Emergency Medical Service Contract proposal to the Phoenix Area Indian Health Service for funding under P.L. 93-638, the Indian Self-Determination Act, to take over and continue emergency medical care and transportation for the ill and injured on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe proposes to take over Emergency Medical Services from the Whiteriver Services Unit on February 01, 1980 to January 31, 1981, for a period of twelve (12) months, based on Tribal EMS scope of work and work plan proposal, and for the purpose of improving the health care services to the White Mountain Apache Tribal people.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe endorses and supports the above-proposed project in order to further the goal of improving the health care services to the White Mountain Apache people.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council designates the Tribal Chairman, or his authorized representative, to act in the capacity of grant and contract negotiator for the project named above with the Phoenix Area Indian Health Service, on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and hereby authorizes him to sign all such documents as are necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

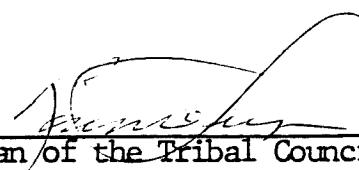
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution NO. 79-92 is hereby rescinded.

The foregoing resolution was on November 07, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
