RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been requested to grant authorization for an appropriate trader's permit to Mr. Larry Tungate, a non-Indian, for the purpose of opening previously existing service station at McNary, Arizona on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, said applicant for a trader's permit intends to include in such business the sale of car parts and cars, and the servicing of vehicles, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has discussed the need and benefit of the operation of such a service station at McNary.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the issuance of appropriate trader's license to Mr. Larry Tungate, a non-Indian, for the purpose of opening a previously existing service station at McNary, Arizona on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman and the Bureau of Indian Affairs Superintendent are hereby authorized to issue such trader's license to Mr. Larry Tungate, under such terms and conditions as they deem necessary and appropriate, including by not limited to the authoriziation to sell car parts and cars, and to service vehicles.

The foregoing resolution was on December 11, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, putsuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
