

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is informed that its C.E.T.A. Program, funded through the U. S. Department of Labor, is geographically within the administrative jurisdiction of Region IX, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been further informed that its program was only temporarily transferred to the Administration of Region X, but that such transfer may become permanent, and
- WHEREAS, said transfer removes the Tribe's C.E.T.A. Program from its otherwise geographical nexus to regional administration under Department of Labor; severs it from administration applicable to other Arizona C.E.T.A. Programs; and burdens the tribal program with unnecessary distance for travel or communication with appropriate regional administrators, and
- WHEREAS, no reasonable justification is given, and none exists, for transferring the White Mountain Apache Tribe C.E.T.A. Program out of Region IX under which it has worked for years, while other Region IX programs have been retained within the Region, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council strongly desires the continued effective operation of its C.E.T.A. Program on the Reservation within Region IX Administration and without deleterious effect to the program that a transfer may cause.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby urgently requests that the White Mountain Apache Tribe C.E.T.A. Program be maintained under the U. S. Department of Labor Region IX Administration and not subjected to a permanent transfer to Region X.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized and directed to notify appropriate officials of the Council's action and to take all further action as is necessary to carry out the purposes of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on January 02, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
