

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised that Congress has provided the Community Services Administration (CSA) with monies to implement the Energy Crisis Assistance Program for the purpose of responding to energy-related crisis affecting poor and near-poor households, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further informed that the sum of \$70,819.00 is set aside through the regional CSA Office for application and allocation to the White Mountain Apache Tribe for such Assistance Program on the Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, this Assistance Program is intended to provide, for the poor and near-poor households: payments to vendors and suppliers of fuel, goods, and other services; establishment of lines of credit with fuel/utility vendors; direct money assistance not to exceed \$50.00 and provision of immediate assistance in the form of goods or services such as emergency fuel deliveries, warm clothing, blankets, temporary shelter, emergency repairs to housing, food, medicine, or other supportive services, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is a tribal government, organized under the Indian Reorganization Act, with a Constitution and By-Laws approved by the Secretary of the Interior, and governed by the Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council deems it appropriate that it exercise the option to enter into a direct grant relationship with CSA for the available Energy Crisis Assistance Program funds, to be administered on behalf of the Tribe through its office of the Administration for Native Americans.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes and directs the application of the Tribe for a direct grant from the Community Services Administration, in the amount of \$70,819.00, for implementation of the Energy Crisis Assistance Program on the Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council directs that such funding be administered for and on behalf of the Tribe through its office of the Administration for Native Americans.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on January 18, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
