


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is continuously concerned over the availability and fair opportunity for all tribal members to obtain housing on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that Mrs. Georgianna (Massey) Joe, a tribal member, has persistently pursued the purchase of a HUD house through the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is informed that Mrs. Joe's application has been denied for unstated or incongruous reasons, and
- WHEREAS, any inferences allegations of discrimination of tribal members creates grave concern in the Tribal Council.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby strongly advises the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority to meet with Mrs. Georgianna Joe as soon as possible to proffer her adequate and reasonable explanation of any consideration of her application for housing and to exhibit all due fairness and equity in providing a housing opportunity to such tribal member.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority is directed to advise and inform the office of the Chairman of the Authority's compliance with this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on February 06, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
