

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is informed that the Arizona Department of Transportation desires to improve a portion of State Highway 60 from Carrizo Bridge to Flying V, and
- WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Transportation is in need of materials for construction of an asphalt concrete overlay, and
- WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Transportation requests a permit for materials from Pit No. 8582, located one-half mile above the community bridge in the river bottom, and
- WHEREAS, as a condition of such permit the Arizona Department of Transportation shall have their contractor slope the sides of the pit, control the side of the channel to prevent erosion of any farms located near the channel, and clean up the area when completed, and
- WHEREAS, it is proposed that the designated haul road will be down the river below the community bridge and not through the community of Carrizo, and
- WHEREAS, the haul road will be graveled and drainage pipe installed where needed, to control dust conditions, and left in place when the job is completed.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman and Superintendent are hereby authorized and directed to issue a non-exclusive permit to the Arizona Department of Transportation for sand and gravel materials as hereinabove described.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Arizona Department of Transportation shall pay the following rates computed on a tonnage basis, for the removal of sand and gravel; six cents (6¢) per ton for all borrow; ten cents (10¢) per ton for all select gravel; twelve cents (12¢) per ton for all ABC, MA, gravel; and fifteen cents (15¢) per ton for all cover material removed from the premises.


The foregoing resolution was on March 17, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
