RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised that executive and legislative efforts of the Federal Government continue in the pursuit of the Orme Dam Project of Central Arizona Project, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of the strenuous and continuing objection of the Fort McDowell Mohave-Apache Tribe to the taking of its tribal land by the United States for this Project, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, acting for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, supports the efforts of all Indian Tribes in defending their respective aboriginal homelands and tribal reservations from further confiscation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants its support to the Fort McDowell Mohave-Apache Tribe in defending and defeating any confiscation of its Reservation for the Orme Dam Project of the Central Arizona Project.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized to direct all such correspondence and communication as is necessary and proper to carry out the purposes of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on April 8, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
