FORT APACHE INDIAN RESOLUTION OF THE AGENCY WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE WHITERIVER, ARIZ. FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised that the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 25, Section 151.10 suthorizes the allocation of grazing privileges to Indian livestock associations without competitive bidding on tribal lands by a tribal governing body, and
- WHEREAS, the grazing land on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation has been divided into range units and separate livestock operations, and
- WHEREAS, Resolution No. 79-223 of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council established a grazing fee of two dollars (\$2.00) per head for the grazing year 1980, 1981, 1982, 1983 and 1984, and
- WHEREAS, the grazing permits authorized and issued by the Tribal Council on July 1, 1975 to the eight cooperative livestock associations, the General Livestock Board and the Tribal Herd Enterprise expire on April 30, 1980.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that new grazing permits be issued to the eight cooperative livestock associations and the Tribal Herd Enterprise for the period May 1, 1980 to April 30, 1985.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the grazing fee previously established by Resolution No. 79-223 is the grazing fee for the permit period May 1, 1980 to April 30, 1985.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attached schedule of Range Units allocated to the livestock associations shall be in effect until April 30, 1985 or until modified or revoked by subsequent resolutions.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attached Range Unit map is hereby approved to eastablish the Range Units allocated to the various livestock associations and the Tribal Herd Enterprise until April 30, 1985 or until modified or revoked by subsequent resolutions.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term "cattle" shall include only cattle of the Hereford breed and "horses" shall include only those authorized by the respective association's Board of Directors to be placed in the association remuda.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the bond requirement for permits exceeding one year is waived on this reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on April 9, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
