## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has acted to approve the participation of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the Section 208 Water Quality Management Planning Program of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA); and
- WHEREAS, EPA has approved a grant for the development of such a plan for the Tribe on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, one requirement of this grant is that a representative Citizens' Advisory Group be appointed by the Tribe in order to participate in the development of a Tribal Water Quality Management Plan; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that said Citizens'
  Advisory Group should include a balanced cross-section
  of tribal citizens, by reflecting the various civic,
  social, recreational, environmental, and public health
  interests on the Reservation, including representatives
  of community-based organizations and economic activities,
  and public officials; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed and considered nominees for such advisory group to serve the best interests of the Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
  Tribe that it hereby appoints the following persons to
  serve the interests of the Tribe and tribal members as
  the Citizens' Advisory Group for the development of a
  Tribal Water Quality Management Plan as heretofore
  directed:
