## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been requested by a tribal member, Mrs. Claralyn (West) Merino, for assistance in curing a domestic water supply problem at her residence in Forestdale, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is informed that such problem can be taken care of through the Indian Health Service, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council may assist such tribal member by directing that this matter is a priority, and
- WHEREAS, human health and personal properties of approximately four families is in jeopardy without such prioritizing by the Council.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby notifies the Indian Health Service that the domestic water supply problems of Mrs. Claralyn (West) Merino and other tribal members in the area in Forestdale is a priority matter to be handled accordingly through the Indian Health Service representatives.

The foregoing resolution was on June 4, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
