FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised and aware that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is currently considering the permanent appointment of a Superintendent to the Fort Apache Indian Agency, and
- WHEREAS, to this end, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has advertised such position and has provided the list of applicants' names to the Tribe for its review, consideration and recommendation to the Bureau of Indian Affairs on such appointment, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council previously rejected the list of nominees and has been provided with a subsequent list of applicants, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has extensively reviewed and considered the background, qualifications, and the experience of the applicants whose names have been presented to the Council.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby notifies the Bureau of Indian Affairs that the Council's first choice for approval of appointment of the position of Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency is Mr. Henry Dodge, and that its alternate choice for such appointment is Mr. Lonnie King.

The foregoing resolution was on June 5, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
